

ROHS 3 Compliance Declaration

Adaptation of RoHS Directive 2015/863 Directive (EU) Extension of the limitation of 4 additional substances

On 4 June 2015, the Commission (EU) received 4 more substances adopted and published in the RoHS Directive 2015/863. These substances are like follows indicated:

DEHP, BBP, DBP and DIBP

The Amendment to Annex II, dated June 04, 2015 additionally restricts the use of DEHP, BBP, DBP and DIBP in Electrical and electronic equipment.

In the current publication, the new Regulation becomes effective June 22, 2019

| No | Substance name | Abbreviation | Threshold Value by homogeneous material |

| 1. | Cadmium | Cd | 100 ppm = 0,01% by weight |
| 2. | Hexavalent Chromium | CrVI | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 3. | Lead | Pb | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 4. | Mercury | Hg | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 5. | Polybromated biphenyls (Mono to Deca) | PBBs | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 6. | Polybromated diphenyl ethers (Mono to Deca) | PBDEs | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 7. | Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate | DEHP | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 8. | Butyl benzyl phthalate | BBP | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 9. | Dibutyl phthalate | DBP | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
| 10. | Diisobutyl phthalate | DIBP | 1000 ppm = 0,1% by weight |
